- Select and implement the most appropriate Class II correction strategy for a given patient presentation, including the Carriere Motion Appliance, the Digital Herbst, aligner-integrated Class II mechanics, and adult Class II approaches.
- Integrate fixed appliances and clear aligners within a single treatment plan using hybrid orthodontic mechanics, applying the WZDM philosophy to guide sequencing decisions.
- Distinguish between case presentations that are suitable for general dental management and those requiring specialist referral, with clear, defensible clinical reasoning.

Background of Speakers:

Dr. Geoffrey Hall is one of Australia's most respected orthodontic educators and a rare dual-credentialed specialist, holding both the MRACDS (Ortho) from the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons and the Diplomate credential of the American Board of Orthodontics. He is one of only seven practitioners in Australia to hold the latter distinction.

A graduate of the University of Melbourne and the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Hall has been treating orthodontic patients for more than 36 years and has personally treated in excess of 15,000 cases, while guiding more than 10,000 further cases for general practitioners across Australia and internationally. He was among the first orthodontists outside the United States to adopt Invisalign clear aligner therapy, beginning in 1999.

As the Founder and Director of The OrthoED Institute (Australia's leading orthodontic training organization for general dentists), Dr. Hall has educated more than 2,500 dental practitioners across Australia, New Zealand, and Asia. OrthoED was recognized as Orthodontic Educator of the Year in 2025. He is a sought-after international lecturer known for his ability to explain complex biomechanical concepts with clarity and clinical relevance, and for his insistence on teaching principles rather than system-specific recipes. He is a co-creator of the CADET Index, a proprietary tool for assessing clear aligner case complexity.

Dr. Martin Poon is a specialist orthodontist, who, together with Dr. Geoffrey Hall, co-owns and practices in a successful clinic, MP Orthodontics. Dr. Poon also owns and practices in a separate practice. On top of balancing two thriving practices in Australia, Dr. Poon also enjoys sharing his orthodontic knowledge through OrthoED as a key partner of Dr. Geoffrey Hall.

Dr. Martin Poon graduated from the University of Melbourne with a Bachelor of Dental Science degree in 2002. Dr. Poon developed an interest in orthodontics when he began his first aligner case in 2002, using the newly introduced Invisalign System. Keen to further his education in this area, he successfully completed a postgraduate Master's degree in Orthodontics and Oral Biology from the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, USA, in 2008. Since this time, Dr. Poon has treated over 4,000 aligner cases.

Dr. Martin Poon is also a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, member of the Australian Dental Association and the American Association of Orthodontics. He is a lecturer for OrthoED, as well as a founding member of the Clear Aligner Planning Service, CAPS.

UNLEASHING THE POWER OF CLEAR ALIGNERS FOR ADULTS AND GROWING PATIENTS

Course Description: In this lecture, Dr. Galante will cover how clear aligners can effectively and predictably treat growing patients as young as six or seven through teen malocclusions and adult complex cases.

Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, attendees will be able to:

- Develop and implement a clinical protocol for managing Class III malocclusions with clear aligners as an alternative to orthognathic surgery.
- Identify appropriate case selection criteria and treatment mechanics for correcting anterior open bites with clear aligners, without surgery or temporary anchorage devices.
- Select and apply clear aligner mandibular advancement mechanics — Mandibular Advancement with Precision Wings (MAEPW) and Mandibular Advancement with Occlusal Blocks (MAOB) — for growing Class II patients with mandibular retrognathia, and compare their clinical advantages over traditional fixed functional appliances.
- Utilize palatal expander effectively in mixed-dentition patients, recognizing indications, limitations, and growth-modification opportunities.
- Design and execute limited clear aligner treatment plans that deliver defined, high-value outcomes within a focused scope — and communicate those goals effectively to patients.

Background of Speaker: Dr. Donna Galante is a board-certified orthodontist in practice for over 35 years in California and Nevada. She has treated over 10,000 cases with Invisalign Aligners and is a Blue Diamond provider. She has also been on their Global Faculty since 2011 and has lectured extensively in the US, Canada, Mexico, Asia, Europe, South America, Australia, and the Middle East to over 20,000 doctors and team members, presenting both clinical and practice workflow topics. She was an adjunct professor of Orthodontics at Harvard and is a guest lecturer at the University of Pennsylvania, UCLA, and the University of the Pacific.

AIRWAY CENTERED ORTHODONTICS

Course Description: An evidence-based approach that distinguishes dental alignment from facial orthopedics, integrating growth-guided mechanics and mid-face development to optimize airway, health, facial esthetics, and long-term function.

Learning Outcomes: Once you see it, you can't unsee it. You can positively impact the health outcome in a patient's life. This is about face health, not just straightening teeth. Course attendees will learn to:

- Adopt early screening principles for pediatric patients.
- Gain confidence in Diagnosis and Treatment Planning options for airway-centered orthodontics.
- Adopt etiology as a basis for long-term retention strategies.
- Emphasis on realistic outcome expectations and managing patient satisfaction.

Background of Speaker: Dr. Bridget Powers is an Orthodontic Specialist. She began private practice in 1999. Prior to that, Dr. Powers, a sole research orthodontist at Invisalign (a then startup company). Dr. Powers received her dental degree from the University of the Pacific in San Francisco. She finished her Master's Degree and advanced orthodontic training at Northwestern University in Chicago.

BRIDGING EAST AND WEST: INTEGRATING LASER ACUPUNCTURE AND BIOFEEDBACK CAPNOMETRY INTO PAEDIATRIC AIRWAY AND DENTAL SLEEP MEDICINE

Course Description: Traditional approaches to Sleep Disordered Breathing (SDB) often focus on mechanical interventions without addressing the underlying physiological and autonomic imbalances. This lecture introduces a hybrid clinical model that combines Western orthodontics and sleep medicine with the ancient wisdom of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). Attendees will learn how to utilise Laser Acupuncture (Photobiomodulation) to activate the parasympathetic nervous system, significantly reducing anxiety and sympathetic overdrive in paediatric patients, particularly those with ADHD and ASD.

The presentation will detail specific protocols using a simple acupuncture protocol to manage pain, suppress the gag reflex, and calm the mind during dental procedures. Furthermore, the lecture will demonstrate the use of real-time biofeedback capnometry to monitor End-Tidal CO₂ (ETCO₂), shifting the diagnostic focus from "Sleep Disordered Breathing" to "Breathing Disordered Sleep." By monitoring breathing physiology alongside structural correction, clinicians can move beyond symptom management to address the root causes of dysfunction, ensuring healthier outcomes for future generations.

Learning Outcomes: By the end of this presentation, attendees should be able to:

- Adopt early screening principles for paediatric patients.
- Analyze the physiological limitations of purely mechanical interventions in Sleep Disordered Breathing (SDB) and understand the necessity of addressing underlying autonomic imbalances.
- Evaluate the role of Laser Acupuncture (Photobiomodulation) in activating the parasympathetic nervous system to reduce anxiety and sympathetic overdrive in paediatric patients, particularly those with ADHD and ASD.
- Apply specific clinical protocols utilizing laser acupuncture to manage pain, suppress the gag reflex, and promote patient calming during dental procedures.
- Interpret real-time biofeedback capnometry data (specifically End-Tidal CO₂) to monitor breathing physiology alongside structural correction.
- Integrate airway corrections with functional breathing monitoring to move beyond symptom management and address the root causes of dysfunction.

Background of Speaker: Dr. Louis Chan is a general dentist and a registered Chinese Medicine Practitioner with a Master's Degree in Chinese Medicine and Acupuncture from RMIT University (2022). His journey into functional airway management began

over a decade ago following mentorship under Dr. Derek Mahony, Dr. Steve Olmos, and the IAO instructor training. Recognizing that structural correction alone was often insufficient for complex airway and TMD cases, Dr. Chan sought to integrate Eastern modalities to enhance treatment efficacy.

Currently, Dr. Chan serves as a Director and Board Member of the International Institute for Orthopostural Education (IIOPE), advocating for a "bottom-up" approach to health that prioritizes early intervention. He has been a guest lecturer for the past five years at Mini Residencies for TMD and Sleep and is a regular speaker at the TMJ & Sleep Centres International meetings. He recently presented at the World Sleep Congress and the World Dentofacial Sleep Society meetings, sharing his protocols on using Laser Acupuncture to improve efficiencies in orthodontics, tongue-tie procedures, and pain control. His passion lies in empowering health professionals to transform young patients' lives, addressing the rising prevalence of ADHD, ASD, and sleep disorders through holistic, evidence-based care.

Background of Speakers:

Dr. Alfredo Valera graduated from the University of the East, College of Dentistry, Philippines in 1975. Dr. Valera is a Past President of the International Association for Orthodontics Philippines Section. He is also a Fellow of the Academy of General Dentistry, a Fellow of the International College of Dentists, and a Fellow of the Pierre Fauchard Academy. Dr. Valera received his Lifetime Diplomate status of the IAO at the 2024 Philippine Section Meeting.

Dr. Lee Willis graduated from the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry in 1996. In 2001, Dr. Willis decided to learn more about dentistry and started his journey into the study of orthodontics. It wasn't long before the theories of TMD grabbed his full attention. Dr. Willis practices in Roseburg, Oregon doing mostly TMD dentistry and orthodontics with a special interest in reverse extraction orthodontics. He has written numerous articles and lectured both nationally and internationally on TMD. Dr. Willis has served nine years on the International Board of Orthodontics as one of the Board Examiners and is a past President of the IBO.

Dr. Gamaliel Urbi Received his Doctor of Dental Medicine from Centro Escolar University in 1990. He holds his Diplomate and Certified Instructor Certificates from the IAO. Dr. Urbi has founded the Asian Association for Myofunctional Orthodontics (AAMO) and Philippine Association for Airway Dentistry and Sleep Medicine (PAADSM). TMJ & AIRWAY INTO ORTHODONTIC CARE

Course Description: Orthodontics, Airway and TMJ are all connected. As dental professionals, we must have a greater knowledge of these connections. We begin by asking, what are the tools we use to help diagnose and treat Airway and TMJ orthodontic patients? Dr. Alpan will explore this question in depth during the course. He will help attendees unlock those bridges between orthodontic care, Airway, and TMJ.

- Why treat to ideal - Not just a dental school mantra
- How symmetry and balance define stability: Principles review of Airway, TMJ and Occlusion
- Does form follow function or does function define form?
- Treatment planning incorporating Airway, TMJ and orthognathic surgery, and multidisciplinary dentistry
- Multiple clinical cases reviewed for integration

NEW AND OLD APPLIANCES AND PROTOCOLS: WHAT IS KEPT AND WHAT IS LEFT

Course Description: The last ten years have been characterized by numerous new appliances and protocols in our profession. Digital impressions, digital cephalometric analysis, maxillary expanders on miniscrews, distalizers and mesializers on TADs, alveolar corticotomy, surgery early and first, aligners (alone or more often combined with other appliances) just to mention some of them. The clinicians may be divided in three major groups: those that haven't adopted any of these "modern" things, those that have adopted almost every modern thing and those that are in the middle spot. This presentation will describe what has substantially changed in private practice and has become routinely used.

Learning Outcomes:

- Treatment should be based on diagnosis, treatment planning, patient's complaint and desire
- Treatment should not be based on appliances and trends
- Appliances should be chosen on what they can really provide
- Biomechanics is a fundamental aspect of any orthodontics treatment
- Scientific and clinical but not trends

Background of Speaker: Dr. Raffaele Spena lives and works in Napoli, Italy, where he earned his DDS. He earned his Specialist Orthodontics degree at the University of Pennsylvania and Ferrara. Dr. Spena is also a renowned international speaker lecturing for multiple organizations, including the AAO Annual Meeting, the European Orthodontics Society, and the Orthodontic Societies for Italy, Spain, Germany, Austria, Greece, Canada, Colombia, China, and Indonesia, and MOIP Meetings in Egypt, Cyprus, Greece, and Italy.

Beyond lecturing around the world, Dr. Spena is also active in orthodontic publications. He is a reviewer for multiple international journals. THE BREAK IN THE BRACHYCEPHALIC GROWTH PATTERN

Course Description: This course will discuss the prevalence of Class II growth and the difficulties to properly get an orthopedic correction when growth of the mandible is deficient. Dr. Warshawsky's lecture will introduce an idea he had which he has refined over the last eleven years. The Casper Class II correction system is a concept that positions the mandible forward while increasing the vertical dimension. The Casper Class II correction system is agnostic to the type of appliances that you use. It can be delivered as a removable appliance, as well as a custom 3D printed metal orthopedic appliance which bonds to the permanent first molars. It can be used with any type of brackets or clear aligners. It can be implemented either fixed or removably to address deficient growth of the mandible, airway issues, and snoring and sleep inefficiencies. Dr. Warshawsky's discussion will look at a plethora of scenarios that are all plagued with growth and/or airway-based issues and Dr. Warshawsky will demonstrate how practitioners stage and implement this appliance to resolve the patients' issues.

Learning Outcomes:

- Learn how to identify and recognize growth deficiency in the mandible
- Learn to implement Casper Class II corrector to improve mandibular retrognathia
- Learn to identify vertical deficiency in cephalometric analysis
- Learn how to manage interphase retention on kids where a mixed dentition is present, but management of the AP plane is required due to increased overjet and lip incompetence
- Learn how to manage severe AP issues long term by changing your approach based on the presence of growth or not in the patient
- Learn how to identify and manage vertical collapse in the brachycephalic facial pattern
- Learn how to reduce snoring and airway resistance using the Casper Class II removable appliance therapy

Background of Speaker: Dr. Neil Mark Warshawsky is an orthodontist who has a background for development and teaching. He founded Get It Straight Orthodontics in Chicago, Illinois in 1992. In addition to his private practice, he enjoys teaching. He was an early adopter of the Invisalign system. As he started to learn the limits of clear aligners, he became adept at Essix therapy. His experience with Essix allowed him to help develop the MTM aligner system. Dr. Warshawsky focused on adult therapy. He learned to do lingual braces to set his practice apart from others. He lectured on lingual mechanics for Incognito Lingual braces from 2008 to 2020. When 3M/Solventum decided that they wanted to develop the Clarity aligner system he was chosen to be the lead clinician. He has been a KOL speaker for many companies

including Dentsply, American Orthodontics, and Solventum. Currently he is a key opinion leader for OrthoFX, Luxcreo, and Celebrace custom printed metal braces. Dr. Warshawsky is an Affiliate of the Angle Society Midwest, as well as a Diplomat of the American Board of Orthodontists. He has authored a multitude of papers on clear aligner therapy, custom mechanics, and craniofacial issues. He is an attending in the Craniofacial Center at the University of Illinois where he is an Assistant Professor in charge of all of the orthodontics. He has written over 10 patents in the field of orthodontics. Earlier this year at the American Association of Orthodontics annual meeting he won runner up for Innovation of the year in Orthodontics with the Casper Class II correction system.

THINKING BEFORE YOU BOND: A DECISION-BASED APPROACH TO APPLIANCE SELECTION AND TREATMENT SEQUENCING IN ORTHODONTICS

Course Description: In a specialty increasingly defined by an expanding toolkit — clear aligners, self-ligating brackets, functional appliances, TADs, and hybrid mechanics — the clinical question is no longer what can be used, but what should be used first, and why. This lecture challenges dentists/orthodontists to move beyond brand loyalty and habit-driven prescribing toward a structured, evidence-informed decision framework for appliance and product selection at the outset of treatment.

Drawing on alternative treatment philosophies — including biologically-driven mechanics, early interceptive staging, arch development protocols, and efficiency-first sequencing — this course introduces a systematic diagnostic lens for matching the patient's presenting malocclusion, skeletal pattern, and growth status to the most appropriate initial intervention. Participants will explore how the first appliance chosen sets the trajectory for the entire case, and how a misaligned initial choice leads to compounding inefficiencies, extended treatment time, and compromised outcomes.

Topics include a comparative analysis of appliance categories and their biomechanical strengths and limitations, decision trees for common clinical presentations, strategies for reducing total chair time through upstream planning, and case-based discussions illustrating how alternative sequencing philosophies have reduced treatment duration in complex Class II, Class III, and crowding cases.

Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Apply a structured diagnostic framework to select the most appropriate initial appliance or product category for a given malocclusion type.
- Compare the biomechanical rationale behind alternative treatment philosophies and evaluate their relevance to sequencing decisions.
- Identify clinical presentations where non-conventional first-stage interventions — such as functional appliances, palatal expanders, or aligner therapy — reduce overall treatment complexity.
- Develop case planning habits that prioritize biological efficiency, minimizing unnecessary phase transitions and appliance changes.
- Critically assess how early product selection decisions impact total treatment time, patient cooperation demands, and clinical outcomes.

Background of Speaker: Dr. Vas Srinivasan graduated from his dental degree in India, and moved to the United States to gain his first Master's degree from University of St. Thomas, Minnesota. He later moved to Australia, and gained his second Master's degree from University of Sydney, Australia with a merit scholarship.

Upon graduation, he moved to the Sunshine Coast, to set up his private practice called Invisible Orthodontics, to primarily focus on treatments to be offered via clear aligners, as early as 2012, when aligners were not that common.

He specializes in non extraction, airway based orthodontic treatment, and treating patients with obstructive sleep apnoea. He has published numerous articles on obstructive sleep apnoea. He currently manages two locations, and operates a paediatric dental clinic and a low-cost braces clinic run by his associates. He went onto acquire instrument rated pilot's license, and during his spare time, he flies his private plane for Australian based charity called Angel Flight.

He is the original doctor founder of the world famous Spark aligners. These aligners took shape from his clinic and now has been used on more than one million patients, and available globally. He lectures throughout the world, and has a two day immersion program that offers an in office visit to learn indirect bonding, and life with clear aligners. Run multiple times a year, it helps young doctors improve their skills and confidence.

AUTOTRANSPLANTATION OF TEETH AND THEIR APPLICATIONS IN THE ORTHODONTIC PRACTICE

Course Description: Autotransplantation is the procedure where an erupted, impacted, or embedded tooth is removed from one site and transplanted to another site in the same individual. This is particularly useful in the orthodontic practice where adolescent patients present with congenitally missing teeth, impacted teeth or severely compromised teeth. Successful tooth autotransplantation in growing patients provides ongoing root development, maintains alveolar bone and periodontal health, allows further skeletal growth, and orthodontic tooth movement.

The ideal timing for autotransplantation is when the root is 2/3 developed with open apex. Over the course we will examine some controversies such as transplantation of teeth with mature apices and the need for root canal treatment. We will also explore some less common indications where deciduous teeth and ankylosed teeth are used in autotransplantation.

It is important to acknowledge that all clinical procedures have costs, risks, advantages and disadvantages. Complications and failures can occur and autotransplantation may not necessarily represent the ideal option for every clinical scenario. Interdisciplinary consultation and collaboration are vital for planning potential autotransplantation cases in order to achieve the best possible outcomes. Early recognition and management of complications can prevent loss of the transplanted tooth.

The phenomenal value of autotransplantation is under recognized and underutilized. We must appreciate the most cost-effective and biocompatible material for dental rehabilitation is sometimes the patient's own natural tooth.

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand the indications for autotransplantation in various clinical dilemma
- Be able to select appropriate donor tooth for replacement in the anterior and posterior sites
- To appreciate and understand the interdisciplinary (endodontic, orthodontic, surgical and prosthodontic) involvement pertaining to autotransplantation
- Communicate with patients the expected outcome from autotransplantation and the possible complications
- Think outside the square and don't let any tooth go to waste

Background of Speaker: Dr. Jen-Ti (Rachel) Hsieh is an oral and maxillofacial surgeon with dual qualifications in Medicine and Dentistry. She completed her specialist surgical training at various hospitals across Queensland and was awarded the Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, FRACDS (OMS).
